Protocols

1. AB Range

- 1.1. One person must be nominated as a range officer for shooting to be allowed.
- 1.2. Eye and hearing protection must be used. Open shoes and open necked shirts are not allowed.
- 1.3. Firearms may only be uncased on the firing point
- 1.4. Firearms and ammunition may not be uncased or handled until 'preparation time' has been called by the range officer.
- 1.5. Firearms must point in a safe direction at all times ie at the backstop or at the ground at least 1m in front of the firing point.
- 1.6. The range officer must check the range is clear before calling 'load'.
- 1.7. Firearms (including magazines) may not be loaded until 'load' has been called by the range officer.
- 1.8. All shooting must be at standard targets in the target holders, all bullets must enter the backstop.
- 1.9. No-one may go forward of the firing point until all firearms have been checked clear and 'guns clear' has been called by the range officer.
- 1.10. Firing points may not be occupied, and firearms and ammunition may not be handled when anyone is forward of the firing point.
- 1.11. All firearms to be checked clear by the range officer and cased before being removed from the firing point.
- 1.12. All malfunctions are to be cleared at the end of the detail under supervision of the range officer.
- 1.13. Lead projectiles only may be used. Jacketed projectiles are not permitted.
- 1.14. Only pistols and pistol calibre rifles may be used. Maximum muzzle velocity for pistols is 1100FPS. Maximum muzzle velocity for rifles is 1400FPS. Magnum loads may not be used.
- 1.15. Maximum calibre is 0.357, except B range where up to 0.45 may be used for Western Action

Protocols

2. CD Range

- 2.1. One person must be nominated as a range officer for shooting to be allowed.
- 2.2. Eye and hearing protection must be used. Open shoes and open necked shirts are not allowed.
- 2.3. Firearms may only be uncased on the firing point or in the safe area.
- 2.4. Firearms and ammunition may not be uncased or handled until 'preparation time' has been called by the range officer.
- 2.5. Firearms must point in a safe direction at all times ie at the backstop or at the ground at least 1m in front of the firing point.
- 2.6. The range officer must check the range is clear before calling 'load'.
- 2.7. Firearms (including magazines) may not be loaded until 'load' has been called by the range officer.
- 2.8. All shooting must be at standard targets in the target holders, all bullets must enter the backstop.
- 2.9. No-one may go forward of the firing point until all firearms have been checked clear and 'guns clear' has been called by the range officer.
- 2.10. Firing points may not be occupied, and firearms and ammunition may not be handled when anyone is forward of the firing point.
- 2.11. All firearms to be checked clear by the range officer and cased before being removed from the firing point.
- 2.12. All malfunctions are to be cleared at the end of the detail under supervision of the range officer.
- 2.13. Lead projectiles only may be used. Jacketed projectiles are not permitted.
- 2.14. Only pistols, .22LR rifles and shotguns may be used. Maximum muzzle velocity is 1100FPS. Magnum loads may not be used.
- 2.15. Maximum calibre for pistols is 0.357, maximum calibre for rifles is .22LR, maximum calibre for shotguns is 12g #7 shot.
- 2.16. All shooting is to be conducted from the baffled firing positions only. Except shotguns which must be across the range towards the quarry face.
- 2.17. Prior to shooting the baffle must be adjusted to suit the individual shooter's position. Refer to baffle setting instructions.

3. Air Range

- 3.1. Only air pistols/air rifles may be used
- 3.2. Pistols/rifles must be pointed in a safe direction at all times

4. Safe Area

- 4.1. Firearms may be uncased and handled in the safe area
- 4.2. Firearms must be checked clear as soon as they are uncased
- 4.3. No ammunition may be present in the safe area
- 4.4. Firearms must point towards the rear wall of the safe area at all times

Protocols

5. Pamphlet

- 5.1. Eye and hearing protection must be used. Open shoes and open necked shirts are not allowed.
- 5.2. Firing points may not be occupied, and firearms and ammunition may not be handled when anyone is forward of the firing point.
- 5.3. Firearms must point in a safe direction at all times ie at the backstop or at the ground at least 1m in front of the firing point. (Firearms may be rested on the bench provided they are pointing in a safe direction.)
- 5.4. No part of the body should be in front of the firearm or near the breech (automatics) or cylinder (revolvers)
- 5.5. Firearms (including magazines) may not be loaded until 'load' has been called by the range officer.
- 5.6. Shooting may not commence until 'start' has been called by the range officer.
- 5.7. Shooting must stop immediately if 'cease fire' or 'stop' is called by the range officer.
- 5.8. All shooting must be at standard targets in the target holders, all bullets must enter the backstop.
- 5.9. No-one may go forward of the firing point until all firearms have been checked clear and 'guns clear' has been called by the range officer.
